Member Finds \$10 Gold Piece!



Best Finds

Club member Neil McElroy found these extraordinary coins while detecting an old home site: 1868 \$10 Gold Coin and a 1912-s Barber Half Dollar.

“It was the first signal I dug when we got there and started detecting,” Neil said. “I pulled that gold coin out of the ground and just started running to where Patrick was. I left my detector and everything behind.”

Patrick could not contain his own excitement and immediately went to share the find with the home owner. Fortunately for them both, the home owner said that their reaction at finding the coin was more special to him than the coin itself and so allowed Neil to keep the coin.

After calming down and returning to the site where the coin had been found, Neil checked the hole one more time — as any good detectorist would. There, within inches of where the gold coin had been, was the 1912-s Barber half dollar. The last old coin to be found that day.

Neil plans to return to the property in Dorena, but the home owner prefers not to have several people on his property, so don't expect to be invited along any time soon! ✂

I would imagine club member **Neil McElroy** will never forget the day he found a \$10 gold coin and a 1912-s Barber half dollar; they were both firsts for him. They were found near each other in the same hole. They were the only old coins found that day.

Neil met someone through Craig's List who mentioned owning property in Dorena, Oregon where a house had

once stood prior to 1904. One thing led to another, and Neil and his son Patrick were given permission to detect the old home site.

As the rest of the club was straining to decipher difficult signals at Island Park in Springfield during the monthly club outing on March 17, Neil and Patrick were on their way to Dorena.







Organized Hunts Have Something for Everyone

Call them “organized hunts” or “competition hunts” or “adult Easter egg hunts”, they are one thing...lots of fun! If you have never been to one, you don’t know what you’re missing. It’s kind of like going to a club meeting, where you rub elbows and share stories with good folks who have the same interest as you — except there are more folks, better stories, and you get to take home treasure!

An organized event of this nature, usually hosted by a metal detecting club, can either be one hunt, one day of hunts, or two days or more of hunts! It really depends on how big the hosting club is, what they can afford to sponsor, and how many volunteers they have working for them.

A full day will likely consist of 2-3 hunts in the morning and 2 hunts in the afternoon. You pay to enter them all or you pay to enter the ones you are most interested in.

Each hunt will be anywhere from 30 minutes long to one hour. Fields are roped off and planted with coins and tokens. The coins can be all silver or a combination of clad and silver with other coins such as Indian Head pennies thrown in for good measure. The tokens are redeemable for prizes. Some hunts may even have a theme or gimmick to them making them more entertaining.

In a competition hunt, the number of coins you find during the hunt is important if you intend to take first, second or third place in the standings. Otherwise, all that is important is finding as many coins as you can and a token or two that you hope will equate to a really good prize.

It’s the “in between” times that are most enjoyable. That is the time, when everyone is resting up between hunts, that you hear some incredible stories like how Neil McElroy found his \$10 gold coin! ✂
