Meeting Minutes

May 16, 2006

The Club meeting was called to order at 7:15pm. There were 9 in attendance and no new members signed-up. A fee of \$1.00 was charged to full members to attend the meeting to cover the cost of the room rental. Meeting was held at El Rev Mexican Restaurant in Dexter.

Barb Tyler, President, opened the meeting with introductions of the Board, and all members introduced themselves. The minutes of the April 18, 2006 meeting were read by Charlene Kerns, Secretary/Treasurer, approved and seconded as written. The Treasurers report was short and brief, noting \$199.00 in the bank, and an explanation to the members for the delay in setting up our checking account and bookkeeping records.

Executive committee made a motion to the membership that dues be increased to \$18.00 for all new full members and \$3.00 for 1st year members. Those who are current members will not see an increase until January 1, 2007. Discussion concerning rising costs to purchase coinage as door prizes and lack of funds to pay existing expenses was the reason for the

increase. The suggestion was put to vote, and passed (8 in favor, 1 opposed).

The membership decided to use Siuslaw Bank for the club's checking account. It was also decided to have two signers; Barb Tyler, President, and Charlene D. Kerns, Secretary/ Treasurer. Before setting up the account, the bank requires that we file for an Assumed Business Name at a cost of \$50.00 and to file for a Federal ID # at no cost. The executive committee is in the process of filing for these items.

Alton Baker Park was the selection for our next club outing. Wayne has offered to look into a group permit for our club. The event will be held Sunday, June 11 from 9:00am to 1:00pm. Member, Wayne Moore will get the exact address and location which will be published in the upcoming newsletter.

Barb also asked for a member to chair the outings, and Wayne Moore stepped up. He is an avid detectorist, and we welcome him to this position. We're all looking forward to some exciting detecting grounds! Barb will be reviewing with Wayne the details of this chair. Thank you, Wayne.
